Self-Assessment September is National Emergency Preparedness Month. This year's theme is *Disasters Don't Plan Ahead. You can.* We would like to remind all employees and supervisors of the importance of emergency preparedness. We encourage everyone to share the information contained in this newsletter with faculty, staff, and students.

## LiveSafe

LiveSafe is a free mobile safety app that the University provides to all students, faculty, staff, parents, alumni, and visitors. This app provides a streamlined way for you to communicate directly with UM safety officials to better protect yourself. And by leveraging the community's eyes and ears, LiveSafe helps to keep the campus safe by preventing crimes before they occur. With LiveSafe, users can:



- **Share information** Submit reports for suspicious activity or an on-campus disturbance with photo, video, or audio attachments. You have the option to send anonymously.
- **Have peace of mind with SafeWalk** Invite others to "virtually escort" and monitor your location on a real-time map. Simultaneously, SafeWalkers can chat with one another or call 911 if needed.
- Navigate the University of Mississippi campus Refer to a full <u>UM map</u> for locations of campus buildings.
- **Summon emergency help** Safety officials can leverage location-data in an emergency, allowing faster response times.
- Access emergency information Have fast access to important campus support resources and emergency procedures, even when you are unable to connect to the Internet.

• **Notifications** - Users can receive important broadcast notifications specific to the University of Mississippi. Notifications must be enabled to receive the broadcast notifications.

As long as users have the capacity to make voice calls, anyone in an emergency should always call 911 or 4911 from a university phone. If, however, a user is unable to make a direct call due to situational or technical issues, or if they must be discrete, then LiveSafe reporting becomes advantageous. Additionally, when the Emergency button is used to dial 9-1-1, dial campus police, or message campus police, location services are enabled to help emergency personnel find your location.

## **RebAlert**

RebAlert is an emergency text message notification service that is provided to employees, students, and parents. If you can receive text messages, you can receive RebAlerts; a smartphone is not required. If you currently don't receive RebAlerts, you can sign up online:

- For employees, log in to <u>myOleMiss</u>, navigate to the Employee tab, My HR Tools, and finally Address and Communication Preferences.
- For students, log in to <u>myOleMiss</u>, navigate to the Student tab, My Profile, and finally Contact Information.
- Parents may sign up for RebAlert by following the <u>step-by-step guide</u>.

The University sends out emergency information from the <u>@RebAlert</u> Twitter account. Simply follow @RebAlert to view these messages. If you turn on notifications for your Twitter app, these messages will appear as alerts on your smartphone.

All inquiries from students or parents should be directed to the Student Life Office at (662) 915-7705.

# **Training with Internal Audit**

### **New!** Lead Responsibly:

A section entitled *Doubt Means Don't: Fiscal Responsibility (Code of Ethics and Conduct)* will be presented by Internal Audit during the Lead Responsibly training. Lead Responsibly is designed for new and existing department heads. The review of financial and administrative topics will empower leaders to make accurate judgements and decisions, manage resources effectively, and act with professional integrity. ### Lead Your Team:

A section on the Code of Ethics and Conduct is presented by Internal Audit during the Lead Your Team training sessions. Lead Your Team is a three-day program designed to develop the skills necessary to supervise professionally and effectively. This is a core course highly recommended for employees with supervisory and people management responsibilities. ### Account Reconciliation:

The Office of Internal Audit offers training on account reconciliation. Sessions are currently scheduled for October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2017 and January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018 from 10:30am-11:30am at Insight Park, 1st Floor Seminar Room (East End). In this class, employees will learn how to perform monthly account reconciliations for revenue and expenditures (including payroll) in order to be compliant with the <u>Responsibilities of Signatory Officers Policy</u>. This class is designed for signatory officers as well as other employees who have been delegated the responsibility for reconciling departmental accounts. Self-assessment is a valuable tool to help identify internal control deficiencies and assist in departmental management and audit preparation. The self-assessment consists of a series of "yes" or "no" questions. "Yes" indicates adequate controls in an area, while "no" indicates control deficiencies.
